Phonics Meeting

This week we are holding a Phonics Session for all Reception and Year 1 parents. By the end of the session, our hope is that you will have a good 'grounding' in phonics – what it is and why the teaching of phonics is so important in developing early reading and writing skills. We will also help you understand how we assess children's phonic ability and how you can help at home.

The meeting starts at 6pm on Wednesday for all Reception and Year 1 parents in the school hall. After about ½ an hour, Reception parents will move to the EYFS room for a meeting with their children's new class teacher, Miss Hooper. Year 1 parents will stay in the hall to hear more about assessment and the Phonics Screening Check – a government test of phonic ability.

We hope that all Reception and Year 1 parents are able to come to the meeting (and all parents are welcome) as we explain how we develop our children into confident, independent readers.
