

Attendance Matters

Good attendance is absolutely vital. We target 96% as a minimum which, at this point in the year, means that a child will have **missed a maximum of 5 days** out of 113 since September. Did you know that a child in the green areas below is over 3 times more likely to achieve the top grades than a child in the red areas? *Absence has a huge impact on a child's achievement and currently 11% of the school are in the lower red zone below.* Let's work together to improve this...
