Home Learning - the final week

A HUGE **thank you** to you all for your support and encouragement this lockdown period. Thanks to you and your efforts supporting home learning, we have managed to maintain a sense of community and relationships in the classes all the way through. Next week is the final week of lockdown so lets have one final week of hard work and giving it our all! I thought I would share one or two statistics with you as we come to the end of this period of home learning:

- The daily average proportion of pupils **attending school as a Key Worker child is 41%** of the school population; this is 18% higher than the Wiltshire Primary School average of 23%.
- St Osmund's has had **97%** of its **pupils regularly engaging in learning**, either online, or in school as a Key Worker child. That is amazing! Well done!

While we are glad to get children back into school, we intend to keep up with Google Classroom as our means of setting homework and liaising with parents about learning. To help with this, we have a number of devices (laptops) which we can give out, free of charge, on long term loan, if device access is a challenge.
