Relationships and Sex Education

I hope that you received my letter sent yesterday which outlines what the school is planning to do for Relationships and Sex Education (RSE).

RSE is now a statutory subject in the primary years and must begin to be taught by the end of the Summer Term 2021. Primary Schools *must* teach Relationships and Health Education, but aren't *required* to teach Sex Education. However, the Department for Education, and the Diocese, recommend that a programme is in place and taught. This is also supported by our school governors. In a world where content and views are much easier to publish (online, mainstream media and TV programmes) it is prudent to ensure our children have an understanding in order to keep themselves safe and to make sense, and is part of a wider whole-school approach to keeping pupils safe, happy and prepared for a life beyond school.

We are advocating a scheme of work to help us deliver RSE called 'Life to the Full' which is rooted in Catholic beliefs and values. It is endorsed by the Diocese and the Department for Education.
