Summer Term News

Wow, the Summer Term comes around quickly! After a year that for so many has dragged along, it is very welcome to be able to get outside more and begin to enjoy the company of others – safely of course. I am just writing here about some reminders and points as we head into this term:

- **Uniform** – Summer Uniform is now permitted – blue gingham summer dresses for the girls, with cardigans and jumpers if needed, and shorts for the boys. We do expect that now the shops are open again, that the correct shoes and uniform are worn.
- **Suncream** – Please apply suncream in the morning before coming to school (some brands do all day creams) and send your child in with some to apply themselves if they can – please name the bottle.
- **Water** – Please ensure your child brings a water bottle in and does not leave it in school. Water bottles should contain only water, no squash or other juice is permitted.
- **Clubs** – at present, we have two sports' clubs running. If restrictions permit and bubbles can be mixed, we hope to provide more in Term 6.
- **Events** – our aim is to have Sports Day, International Day and the usual Year 6 end of year events in Term 6 which should be possible if the government's lockdown exit strategy continues on course.
- **Punctuality** – While we are still on staggered starts and ends of the day, please do ensure that you are on time in the morning. Please do not be too early (2-3 mins is fine) so there are fewer queues on Carmelite Way. Thank you so much for your enthusiasm and cooperation! 😊
