If your child is absent from school, please inform the office **every day** they are off, so the register is completed correctly. Please provide us with your child's name, year group and reason for absence. Remember to if your child has vomited/had diarrhoea you must keep them off for 48 hours after the last episode.

If you are running late and your child's class has already entered the building your child **must** come in through the school office so that the office can check they have a lunch ordered and mark their attendance in the register.
