Covid-19 Infections and What To Do

It is quite clear that infections are rising nationally and we are hearing more and more about people in our community or families being told they have Covid-19.

Thankfully the vast majority of these positive cases result in minor illness but we have protocols and actions to deal with cases. I am writing to you today to ensure that everyone understands what we will do as a school with suspected or positive cases.

If your child (or an adult) displays Covid symptoms – new or continuous cough, or temperature, or loss of taste/smell, then they will be sent home and you must arrange a PCR test. Your child may only return to school if the test result is negative, or if positive, isolate for 10 days. NHS test and trace will assist in identifying close contacts and will provide advice on testing and isolation as required. You are advised to call 119 for any advice around Covid-19 infections, testing and tracing.

Given that we need to send home any symptomatic children, it is important that we have an up to date contact number for you, and that you are able to collect your child quickly.

Clubs

We now have our suite of after school clubs up and running and we are really excited to be able to bring children together to take part in activities which enrich the whole curriculum. We have a range of sport and non-sporty clubs across the week to cater for different year groups. The clubs will change on Term 2, running from the second week onwards.
