# **Cold and Sickness**

It is vital that if your child has any of the following symptoms, you get a PCR test to test for a possible Covid infection:

- New or continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss or change in taste or smell

If your child is negative, OR does not have any of these symptoms, then they may attend school.

Absence rates at the moment are higher than normal, even allowing for covid-related absence. We have noticed a higher proportion of colds and runny noses, but you can send your child in as long as they are not Covid-positive or have one of the above symptoms.

The staff are very good at spotting when a child is too poorly to be in school, and if that is the case, they will call you!
