Ash Wednesday Mass



This week we marked the beginning of Lent by hosting Mass in school on Ash Wednesday. Father Joseph led us in a thought-provoking service to begin this period of reflection and reconciliation.

Lent is that time of repentance, where we think about giving more – an extra special effort! We think about giving more to God, more sacrifice of our time, and giving more to others. The children's Lenten promises, now on display in the hall, show the whole community how the children are making that effort this Lent. Some, you will be pleased to know, say 'I am going to make sure I clean my room to help out' and 'I am going to be nicer to my little brother'. 'I am going to give up my time to help someone else'. These are all admirable promises and show that the children are reflecting on the fact that Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us.

The children realise that all sacrifices, no matter how small, have significance if they have been thought through, require determination and will do good.

Arriving at School

Our playground is staffed from 08:45 each morning for the 10 minutes prior to the bell being rung for the start of the school day at 08:55.

If parents wish to arrive early with their child and stay in the playground, then that is absolutely fine. You could visit the library bus too!

However, no children (including Year 6 who sometimes walk to school by themselves) should be arriving at school before 08:45 on their own; they would be unsupervised and this is therefore potentially unsafe.
