We have a statutory duty to report on attendance and I am pleased to say that it has significantly improved over the second half of this year; we now have an overall attendance rate above the national average – 94.4% compared to a national figure of 93.7%. **Thank you** to all our families for making such a concerted effort to be in school every day. Please remember that holiday absence will not be authorised and in September, to give the children the best possible start to the term, the children need to be in school with their new teachers, building friendships and settling in.
