Homework

As detailed on the curriculum letters, we have been reviewing our homework practices and expectations recently. Staff are explaining these expectations in the *Meet the Teacher* meetings. First and foremost, homework should not be stressful! It might not be everyone's favourite activity but it has been proven to have a positive impact on children's learning. It helps reinforce key concepts, develops essential skills, and enables children to apply knowledge to real-life situations. Completing homework also helps instil discipline and time management skills, preparing children for the challenges of secondary school and beyond.

We encourage you to support your child in developing good homework habits. Create a quiet and organised study area at home, establish a regular routine, and provide guidance and assistance when needed; crucially, the homework set should only cover concepts that have already been taught in class so it should be a useful, achievable and maybe even enjoyable experience for you and your child.

Homework expectations vary from year to year and are progressively more demanding in terms of challenge and time from Reception to Year 6. Reading is a common theme for all classes – 5x per week. Your child should be able to decode the words in their books when they are reading the scheme books – what we call 100% phonically decodable. This helps the children to build their fluency as readers. If your child is struggling to decode (translate the sound-letter correspondances) then please let us know so we can reassess the book they have been given. Please read with them, a good model to work from when reading with your child is the 'I read' (parent), 'we read' (together) followed by 'you read' (your child). Finally, please record your reading in the record book and see your child's class teacher if you have any questions.
